

Happy 2023 to Everyone!

We hope that everyone managed to stay healthy throughout the holidays and enjoy time with family and friends. We start the new year with the expectation of more great programs and activities! Our branch has been growing, and we have several new members who bring new energy to our group.

Let's Talk About Money. In 2023, the board needs to address our budget and expenditures. For the past 2 years, we have had to use reserves to cover some expenses because we have not had enough revenue coming into the branch to handle expenses. As part of the remedy, the board voted in November to propose to the membership a small increase in branch dues starting next fiscal year.

Branch revenue was raised at the San Ramon Art and Wind Festival Ice Cream Sale, and it has been a wonderful way to raise operations funds in just two days. However, with the pandemic, we lost that revenue source and used reserve funds to make up the shortfall. Even with our resumed participation in the festival, the income isn't enough. Our branch is frugal when it comes to spending. We have enough money for basic operations, but events cost more because expenses for venues and guests have increased. Our programs introduce our branch to new people which, in turn, help us grow.

How Our Dues Are Allotted. Right now, your total annual dues are \$107. AAUW National gets \$67, AAUW California receives \$20, and our branch receives \$20. Neither National nor AAUW state offices intend to raise dues next year. Currently, we have one of the lowest branch dues in the nation. We have not raised dues for our branch in many years.

Now We Need Your Input. The proposed increase is \$8 per year, increasing your total annual dues to \$115 with \$28 going to our branch. While this amount doesn't fully cover the difference between our income and what we spend annually, it does reduce how much we must use from reserves.

Members will vote on the proposal to raise dues at the Fund Tea on April 22. Between now and then, we invite you to please come to the board meetings to let us know what you think of the proposed dues increase. Board meetings are the first Monday via Zoom and begin at 7:00 PM. We very much want your questions and input.

To receive a Zoom link to the board meeting, simply contact Kathleen or me. Alternatively, we are both available to discuss this important decision with you individually.

Please be an active participant in this discussion. This decision doesn't come lightly. We want to ensure that all members have a voice in the decision.

We both wish you and your loved ones a healthy and joyous 2023.



Meet Susan Alcorn Local Author and International Hiker

Zoom in on Thursday, January 19 with our guest speaker and author, Susan Alcorn, who hopes to encourage and inspire you to get outdoors and walk, hike, or saunter.

Susan will talk about how she became a long-distance hiker in her forties and how that led to writing about her hiking and traveling adventures throughout the world. Becoming a more serious hiker also brought her into the hiking community, where she learned about, and was inspired by, others to go farther afield.

Susan's most recent book, *Walk, Hike, Saunter: Seasoned Women Hikers Share Tales and Trails*, is based on interviews that she conducted with 32 women hikers, all 45 and older. Susan will discuss why she decided to write this book, how and why she selected the women, and how her writing process works.

Though Susan loves hiking in far-flung places, she also feels extremely lucky to live in the Bay Area, with our thousands of miles of trails in our city, regional, state, and national parks. She loves exploring new trails, so—with her husband, Ralph, and a few friends—she is currently working on two new challenges: circumnavigating the Bay Area Ridge Trail and walking every street in Alameda (it's flat and easy to get to!). Bottom line, there are paths and trails suitable for people of all ages, abilities, and interests everywhere we look and, with our exceptional climate, we can enjoy many of them year round!

2023 Plans: 8 Campers!

Annually, our Branch of AAUW sends young women from the four San Ramon middle schools to Tech Trek—a weeklong Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (“STEM”) summer camp. This year we want to send six seventh-grade girls to Tech Trek camp, to be held in-person at Sonoma State University in Rohnert Park, California. We also want to send two girls to a virtual camp. According to the draft schedule, the Sonoma camp will take place the week of June 18–24 for a fee of \$1,000 per camper. The virtual camp will take place the week of July 23–28 for a fee of \$500 per camper.

Public Policy



November 8th Was a Good Day for Women!

The election is finally over—and overall, AAUW members can be pretty happy with the results. Here are a few highlights:

- One woman was added to each house of Congress: the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate, bringing the numbers to 124 (H) and 25 (S).
- Of the total of 149, 54 are women of color.
- With Nancy Pelosi stepping down as Speaker of the House, we lost the most powerful woman's voice in government, but still have a woman on the minority leadership team, Minority Whip Katherine Clark.
- Governors of 12 states are now women.
- 23% of all mayors across the nation are women, including our brand new and first woman mayor of Los Angeles, Karen Bass.
- 32 women won seats in the California Legislature (total confirmed 44, 3 pending)
- All executive positions in California except Governor are filled by women, including Secretary of State, Lieutenant Governor, Treasurer, and Controller.
- Proposition 1 prevailed and women's right to control their own reproductive choices is now enshrined in our [California state] constitution.

The state Public Policy Committee thanks each and every AAUW California member who voted, who assisted in [the AAUW CA] Voter Education (VE) campaign by spreading our messages on social media, who took the pledge to vote for Prop 1 (we had 437 sign up!), and who worked within their branches to do their own VE events.

Next challenge: Let's add California to that list of states with a woman governor! Together we can—and will—change the world!




