

They have also been involved in other community and/or social activities, as well as part-time jobs.

Two of these students attend California High School, and one is a student at Dougherty Valley. We have chosen all three to receive our \$1,000 scholarships. Tech Trek



"I was very excited when I learned that my Math teacher had nominated me for a chance to participate in a renowned and fun program like Tech Trek, and believe it will be an unforgettable experience for me. From a young age, I have always loved Science and Math. I still remember the joy I experienced learning the periodic table song in second grade with my older sister, though now I am beginning to understand it much better. I continue my passion towards STEM by participating in math olympiads and math kangaroo, or paying keen attention during the squid dissection, or watching programs like "Eons" by PBS . I have also discovered my love for coding, learning different languages like Python, html and Javascript.

I hope to continue my interest in the field of STEM, not just learning individual aspects, but combining them to maximize outcomes like using Math with Chemistry, or Technology with Biology. Tech Trek has so many opportunities, like fun science experiments, environmental projects, coding workshops, drone flying activities, and learning life skills through math. In Tech Trek, I hope to interact with like-minded peers and collaborate with them in fun experiments and group projects and make lasting friendships. I look forward to meeting inspirational women leaders and experts in the STEM field, understanding their journey and experiences, and learning from them. Given the broad horizon of the Tech Trek program, I want to be a part of this memorable experience and enrich my knowledge in STEM. "

This is an example of the caliber of the 14 applicants for camp. The branch's Tech Trek committee selected 8 young women to be sponsored for the 2023 AAUW STEM Camps this summer and 3 young women as alternates (one of the alternates declined to be wait-listed). The selected number of campers is in agreement with the branch's MOU (Memorandum Of Understanding) with State AAUW. The \$7,500 funding for these sponsorships is already in the branch's Sonoma Camp account (along with a similar carryover balance).

The rapid, efficient selection process was enabled by the Readers Team consisting of Kathy Senti, Purvi Rawal, Becky Said and Arila Barnes (led by Stella Hadjimarkos) and the Interview Team consisting of Sindhura Putumbaka, Nancy Vandell, and Lucy Weed (led by Karen Rice).

We are extremely grateful to have such a hard-working, dedicated, insightful, and wise group for this complex selection process. It has been a wonderful and exciting Tech Trek selection process, and we look forward to hearing from our campers in September.


